

NUS CLS Japanese Language Placement Test for Yale-NUS Students (Semester 1, AY2019/2020)

The NUS Centre for Language Studies (CLS) is conducting a round of **Japanese Placement Test** on **6th May 2019 (Monday)** for Yale-NUS students.

If you are interested in taking up CLS Japanese module in **Semester 1, AY2019/2020 at level 2000 and above but have not meet the prerequisites**, please refer to the following placement test details:

Written Test Date:	6 th May 2019, Monday, 10am followed by oral interview in the afternoon

Placement Test Registration:	Please complete this form and email it directly to Ms Kitai Saeko (clskita@nus.edu.sg) before 2nd May 2019 (Thursday) . Additionally, you are required to submit the signed physical copy (front and back) on the test day.

Important Points To Note:

1. Please refer to this [tentative list](#) of modules that CLS will be offering in Semester 1, AY2019/2020.
2. If you are planning to attend an intensive Japanese language course or do an intensive self-study during the summer, you are strongly recommended to attend the placement test on 26th July or 5th August 2019 (tentative dates). You may look out for the notice of placement tests posted on the [CLS website](#) or contact the [CLS General Office](#) directly. After you have completed the placement test, you will be notified of the outcome by CLS. Thereafter, you can proceed to register the module via ModReg@EduRec during Round 2 or Round 3 depending on when you have completed the placement test.
3. This placement test on 6th May 2019 (Monday) is strictly for Yale-NUS students who wish to read CLS Japanese modules in Semester 1, AY2019/2020. If you are not planning to read CLS Japanese module in Semester 1, AY2019/2020, please take the placement test immediately before the semester that you wish to read the CLS Japanese module.
4. If you have no prior knowledge of Japanese language, you do not need to sit for the placement test. Please register the CLS module(s) in ModReg@EduRec directly during Round 2 and 3.
5. Please note the following after you have taken the placement test on 6th May 2019 (Monday):
 - You must inform Registry soonest after you received your placement test outcome from CLS so that Registry can contact you for pre-allocation matters.
 - Once the timetable for NUS CLS modules is available in early July, Registry will contact you for submission of your preferred lecture group. If there is a timetable clash with your allocated Yale-NUS module(s), you are required to inform Registry on which module you want to be registered.
 - If adding the Japanese module leads to an overload, you will not be pre-allocated. Instead, you may drop an allocated module and register for the CLS module via ModReg@EduRec during Round 2. If you have obtained approval from your Assistant Dean to overload, you may register for the overload module in Round 3.
 - For modules with multiple tutorial class options, you will only be pre-allocated with the main lecture class and you will need to select your tutorial class via ModReg@EduRec in Round 3.
