

NUS Centre for Language Studies (CLS) Placement Tests in Semester 2, AY2020/2021 for Yale-NUS Students

Placement tests are for students who do not meet the pre-requisites of advanced level NUS CLS modules.

I. Japanese Placement Test

NUS CLS will run the Japanese placement test on **8 December 2020 (Tuesday)** for Yale-NUS students who are interested to enroll in the Japanese Language module in Semester 2, AY2020/2021.

What if I cannot make it on the test day? For students who are taking the Japanese placement test on 8 December 2020: Please notify Yale-NUS Registry at registry@yale-nus.edu.sg of your Japanese placement test outcome after you receive notification from NUS CLS so that the main lecture of the Japanese language module can be pre-allocated to you. If there is a timetable clash between the Japanese language module and your allocated Yale-NUS module(s), you are required to inform Yale-NUS Registry which module you want to be registered in. You will proceed to select the tutorial class for your Japanese language module via ModReg@EduRec during the Select Tutorials/Labs rounds at the beginning of the semester. Please refer [here](#) for the NUS ModReg schedule for the timeline for tutorials selection.

For students who are taking the Japanese placement test on 29 December 2020 and 6 January 2021: You will need to select the main lecture and tutorial class of the Japanese language module via ModReg@EduRec in Round 2 or Round 3 after knowing your Japanese placement test outcome from NUS CLS.

II. NUS CLS Placement Tests (excluding Japanese)

Students who are taking placement tests (excluding Japanese) are to follow up with NUS CLS directly. Information on modules offered, NUS CLS coordinators and placement tests dates, will be published on the [NUS CLS website](#). You will be notified of the outcome of the placement test by NUS CLS. Thereafter, you can proceed to register for the module via ModReg@EduRec during Round 2 or Round 3.

III. Important Notes for Students

1. If you have no prior knowledge of the language that you are interested to study, you do not need to sit for any placement tests. Please register for the beginning level NUS CLS module(s) in [Canvas](#) (link active only in Round 1) in Round 1 or ModReg@EduRec in Round 2 and Round 3.
2. If enrolment in the NUS CLS module leads to an overload, you **will not be pre-allocated** to the module. Instead, you may drop an allocated module and register for the NUS CLS module via ModReg@EduRec during Round 2 or Round 3. If you have obtained approval from your Assistant Dean to overload, you should inform Registry and may register for the overload NUS CLS module in Round 3.
3. Do note that you will only be pre-allocated to the lecture section of the CLS module. For modules with tutorial sections, you are required to select your tutorial class via Select Tutorials/Labs rounds at the beginning of the semester.
